## Monroe County Department of Public Health Warns of Potential Exposure to COVID-19 at Minq Lounge

### **Please note change in date of event**

The Monroe County Department of Public Health is alerting individuals who attended the “All Black Attire” event late **Saturday night, Oct. 16** at Minq Lounge, 398 W. Main St. in Rochester, of a possible exposure to COVID-19.

At least one individual in attendance from 12 a.m. until 2 a.m. (Sunday) has tested positive for COVID-19 and others may have come into close contact with that individual.

Attendees experiencing COVID-like symptoms, regardless of vaccination status, and all unvaccinated attendees should immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH at (585)753-5555.

Attendees who are fully vaccinated and not currently experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should immediately get tested for COVID-19 and wear a mask in public indoor settings through Sunday, **October 26**, at minimum. If symptoms develop during this time, immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH at (585) 753-5555.

*In general, the Monroe County Department of Public Health does not comment on potential or confirmed cases of COVID-19 concerning specific individuals, businesses or institutions unless doing so is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to public health.*
