Monroe County Department of Public Health Warns of Potential Exposures to COVID-19 at Greece Assembly of God Church and Other Locations

The Monroe County Department of Public Health is alerting individuals who were at **Greece Assembly of God, 750 Long Pond Rd.**, that they may have been exposed to COVID-19 during church services or other church activities on the following dates:

- Thursday, Oct. 21, 2021
- Friday, Oct. 22, 2021
- Saturday, Oct. 23, 2021
- Sunday, Oct. 24, 2021

In addition, MCDPH is alerting individuals who were at the following locations on the dates and times specified that they may have been exposed to COVID-19:

- Thursday, Oct. 21, 2021
Vay-Schleich & Meeson Funeral Home, Greece Chapel, 1075 Long Pond Rd., during calling hours from 2 – 4 PM and 7 – 9 PM.
- Friday, Oct. 22, 2021
Red Fedele's Brook House Restaurant, 920 Elmridge Center Dr., from 2 – 4:30 PM in a private event related to the above calling hours and funeral.

Multiple individuals who were in attendance at these locations have tested positive for COVID-19. The following attendees should immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH as soon as possible at 585-753-5555:

- Attendees experiencing COVID-like symptoms, regardless of vaccination status
- All unvaccinated attendees

Attendees who are fully vaccinated and not currently experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should immediately get tested for COVID-19 and wear a mask in public indoor settings. If symptoms develop during this time, immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH at (585) 753-5555.

In addition, MCDPH has received reports of multiple positive home tests among individuals affiliated with Greece Assembly of God. **MCDPH reminds all individuals who test positive for COVID-19 using a home test kit to report the positive result using the County's COVID-19 Positive Home Test Reporting portal at:**
