Monroe County Department of Public Health Warns of Potential Exposures to COVID-19 at Breast Cancer Fundraiser

The Monroe County Department of Public Health is alerting individuals who participated in the private breast cancer fundraising event from 12 - 3:30 PM on Saturday, Oct. 23, 2021, at Bowl-A-Roll Lanes, 1560 Jefferson Rd., that they may have been exposed to COVID-19.

At least one participant at the closed fundraising event has tested positive for COVID-19. All unvaccinated participants and vaccinated participants with symptoms should immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH as soon as possible at 585-753-5555.

Attendees who are fully vaccinated and not currently experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should immediately get tested for COVID-19 and wear a mask in public indoor settings. If symptoms develop during this time, immediately self-quarantine and contact MCDPH at 585-753-5555.
